YOUTH MINISTRY UPDATE

Having enjoyed the parish for the last eight months and gotten to know our community, I have come to the realization that there is an opportunity for our parish to grow and expand upon our firm foundation. For the last six years we have had the benefit of two Youth Ministers who have touched the lives of a small segment of our parish. The youth's involvement in the community, church, and various social issues are all wonderful initiatives, but I think we can do more. To complement what has been developed so far, I feel a need to extend this reach to include our parents and younger members of the parish and to incorporate faith formation and develop programs for those preparing for Baptism, First Reconciliation, First Eucharist, Confirmation, and Marriage.

These are key moments in the lives of families and can be graced moments; great moments of faith. With a formalized faith formation program, I believe we can enhance the richness of our spiritual life, combining community outreach with faith development.

This perspective has led me to my decision to eliminate the role of Youth Minister and replace it with a broader faith formation role that will take a more holistic approach to helping parishioners of all ages fully experience their faith and be engaged in our community. Our plans will take shape over the coming weeks and I look forward to sharing more about this new direction in the near future.

I want to thank Jonathan Nix for his service to our community over the past few years and look forward to expanding our outreach to families and all the members of our parish as we venture forth in faith. We wish Jonathan all the best in his future endeavors.

It Takes a Village to Raise a Child In the same way our community has a key role in raising the next generation of Catholics. Bringing children to church is really important.
