Sacramental Preparation 2017-2018 at St. Bonaventure Parish

The following meetings are for parishioners of St. Bonaventure church. If you are not registered with the parish, but worship here regularly or wish to make our community your spiritual home, then you are welcome! Preparation for First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion

Roman Catholic children are prepared to celebrate their First Reconciliation (Confession) and First Communion around the age of 7.
