Mission Appeal from COAR, a School and **Orphanage in El Salvador**

COAR, which stands for the Community Oscar Arnulfo Romero, will be making a mission appeal on August 24 and 25, 2019 asking for your prayers, awareness, and generosity.

COAR is located in Zaragoza, El Salvador. It was founded in 1980 by a Cleveland Diocese Mission Team priest Fr. Ken Myers during El Salvador's brutal civil war. Fr. Ken and fellow Cleveland Mission Team members Sr. Dorothy Kazel, OSU, and Jean Donovan (murdered December 2, 1980) began gathering orphans from refugee camps and bringing them back to the Mission's parish of Zaragoza.

COAR is now known as the "Children's Village" in El Salvador with 800-day students, 100 in foster care, a medical and dental clinic, pharmacy and trade shops. It is administered directly by the Archbishop of San Salvador through his Vicariate of Human Development. One of the first orphans of COAR served as mayor of Zaragoza from 1998 – 2002. To protect the most vulnerable simply requires food, shelter and housemothers. To educate the children to modernize their economy requires updated computers and new classrooms. Please help us respond to the needs of the impoverished among us and help them build a better future.



Sacramental Preparation 2019-2020 at St. Bonaventure Parish

The following information meetings are for parishioners of St. Bonaventure's Church.

Preparation for First Reconciliation and First Communion

Roman Catholic children may begin to be prepared to celebrate their First Reconciliation (Confession) and First Communion around the age of 7. If you are the parent of a 7year-old child (in grade 2), or older, who is baptised Roman Catholic, then it will be important for you to attend one of the following Parent Information Meetings in the Main Hall of the Parish Centre to learn about the preparation process, registration, and celebration of these Sacraments:

- Sunday, September 22nd, 1:15 to 2:45 pm, or
- Tuesday, September 24th, 7:00 to 8:30 pm

Preparation for Confirmation

In September 2015, the age when youth may begin to prepare for and celebrate Confirmation was lowered to age 12 in the Archdiocese of Toronto. If your child is baptised Roman Catholic and 12 years old (grade 7) or older, then it will be important for you **and** your son or daughter to attend **one** of the following Parent-Youth Confirmation Information Meetings held in the Main Hall of the Parish Centre to learn about the preparation process, registration, and celebration of Confirmation:

- Sunday, October 6th, 1:15 to 2:30 pm, or
- Tuesday, October 8th, 7:00 to 8:15 pm
