

The Spirit gives life; the flesh counts for nothing. The words I have spoken to you -they are full of the Spirit and life. John 6:63

According to Pope Francis how do we become inserted into Christ's immense work of salvation? When and how does Christ sharpen our spiritual vision with his love?

"Lord, to whom shall we go?" We too, who belong to the Church today, pose this question. Even if it is more hesitant

We need to learn how to live the Holy Mass.



Sacramental Preparation 2018-2019 at St. Bonaventure Parish

Preparation for First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion

Roman Catholic children may begin to be prepared to celebrate their First Reconciliation (Confession) and First Communion around the age of 7. If you are the parent of a 7-year-old child (in grade 2), or older, who is baptised Roman Catholic, then it is important for you to attend one of the following parent information meetings in the Main Hall of the Parish Centre to learn about the preparation process, registration, and celebration of these Sacraments: •Sunday, September 23rd from 1:15 to 2:45 pm, or •Tuesday, September 25th from 7:00 to 8:30 pm

Preparation for Confirmation

In September 2015, the age when youth may begin to prepare for and celebrate Confirmation was lowered to age 12 in the Archdiocese of Toronto.
