Community Life

DID YOU KNOW?

Does it bother you that on December 26 all the sounds and sights of Christmas has disappeared? Radio stations return to their normal fare of music with all hints of "Joy to the world" silenced for another year. Everywhere Christmas quickly fades into memory Everywhere except in the churches and homes of Catholics. The Missal, the official prayer book of the Church teaches us that:

> The Church holds sacred the memorial of Christ's birth and early manifestations throughout the Christmas season. The season runs from the Vigil of Christmas (Dec. 24) until the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord (Jan.13)

The Christmas feast is extended through an entire season. For eight full days after Dec. 25 the people of God celebrate Christmas every day in our Liturgy. After the 8-day Octave, the celebrations continue drawing our attention to the God who was born as a member of a human family (Dec. 30 -Feast of the Holy Family) from a human Mother (Jan. 1: The Solemnity of Mary the Mother of God). The season continues as we recognize the Child who revealed Himself as Saviour of all nations (Jan. 6: The Solemnity of the Epiphany) and concludes with the Father proclaiming Jesus to be His Own Beloved Son (Jan. 13: The Feast of the Baptism of the Lord.)

The world may banish the sounds of Christmas, but the Catholic people continue to sing of God become human. Decorations may disappear from the stores, but our churches and homes continue to be bedecked with some signs of the season: the greens of Life, the Lights of the Star, the flames of God's love. After the feast the world soon returns to the darkness and cold of winter, but Catholics continue to hold up a new hope for a dark, cold world. Our Christmas Season becomes a Spring in the midst of winter. Through the celebrations of the Christmas Season, in church and at home. we proclaim: The Light and warmth of the love of God have conquered; for to us a Child is born; God is with us.

The long vigil of Advent preparation is now completed. Having prepared so well, can we also maintain the spirit and celebrate well? Christmas is not a day, it's a season. Let the candles be lit. Let the carols be sung. Let the New Spring spread out with holiday meals and visits and worship. Let the world know the reason for our joy and hope: We are not alone. God is with us.


