When I was a student in the seminary, a professor told us: "It's begun with the taking of life at its beginning, it will go further with the taking of any life." He was predicting euthanasia. We didn't believe him. It's here. It's called MAiD (Medical Assistance in Dying).

On Sunday, March 8, Sister Mary Rowell will join us for a presentation on this topic. Sr. Mary is a religious Sister of the Congregation of St. Joseph, Canada, a professor of Theology at Regis and St. Michael College at the University of Toronto, and a bioethicist.
