



Jesus asked the disciples, "what are you looking for"? How would you answer that question? Then there was a second loaded question: "Where are you staying"? This could be restated, "Where can we spend time with vou?" When the disciple took time with Jesus, did they find what they were looking for, even if just by instinct? Will this work for you?
