Thursday, February 2, 2017

In the Archdiocese of Toronto we are blessed to have living and serving among us more than 900 religious men and women of 100 different religious congregations. This World Day for Consecrated Life is a wonderful opportunity for us to thank God for the gifts of these religious sisters, brothers and priests and to pray for God's blessing upon them in their efforts to faithfully live the evangelical counsels of poverty, chastity and obedience.

Bishop Wayne Kirkpatrick will preside at a special Mass on Sunday, January 29 at 3:00 pm at St. Paul's Basilica, Toronto in celebration of the vocation and witness of these special men and women religious who are such a vital and important part of the life and ministry of the Church in our Archdiocese. All are welcome to attend.

"Together, Opening Paths of Hope"

This is our third installment of four proposals from Brother Alois of the Taizé Community. It provides us with much food for thought and discussion, as parishioners entrusted by the Lord to live in Communiton with God and one another.

Third Proposal: Come together to allow the dynamism of the Gospel to be revealed

Every day the first believers continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad an sincere hearts. (Acts 2:46)

There are different kinds of gifts, but the same Spirit distributes them. There are different kinds of service, but we serve the same Lord. (1 Corinthians 12:4-5)

Do not forget to show hospitality to strangers, for by so doing some people have shown hospitality to angels without knowing it. (Hebrews 13:2)

The Bible tells the story of two men, Peter and Cornelius, who were deeply opposed on all counts, but who met one another and in so doing discovered a truth previously unknown to either of them. They needed to be together in order to understand that the Holy Spirit brings down walls and unites those who thought they were strangers. The dynamism of the Gospel is only revealed when we are together. (Acts os the Apostles :10 and 11)

When Christians are divided, between denominations or within the same Church, the Gospel message is obscured. Will we be able to walk together without letting our differences separate us? If we, as Christians, find a way to show that unity is possible in our diversity, we will help all humanity to be a more united family.

- Christ unites in one community men and women, children and elderly people, of all horizons, languages and cultures, and even those from nations historically opposed. Let us find simple ways to show this in the places where we live.
- To remain alive, every community is called to go out of itself. Can we develop an attitude of hospitality, in the image of God, towards Christians who have positions very different from our own? Such openess of heart requires an effort of "translation," since different beliefs and convictions can be like languages foreign to one another.
- Even if the memory of mutual intolerance among Christians separated over the course of history remains alive and not all the threads can be untangled, will we dare to welcome each other, by forgiving, and without trying to establish who was right or who was wrong? There is no reconciliation without sacrifice.
- Hospitality goes hand in hand with recognizing the otherness of others. When their beliefs remain incomprehensible to us, we can be attentive to their authenticity. There should be a festive element in the discovery of others!
