



We have heard this story many times. This would be the time, that we would bring out the tiny camels and the wise men and place them in our Nativity crèche. It would be the last act of our Christmas story. In a few days the small figures and other decorations still up from this joyous season would be carefully put away for another year.

Theologians note that only Matthew records the story, and some suggest it is a pious fiction designed to integrate older writings into the birth narrative of Jesus. Questions abound but the essential messages remain. For Paul, it is the mystery now "made known to humankind." Isaiah urges rejoicing: Arise, shine, for your light has come." The Epiphany reveals that Christ now had come among us all.
