





SATURDAY, JULY 15TH THE FEAST OF ST. BONAVENTURE

(Join us for coffee and pastries after the 9:00 am Mass next Saturday in the Main Hall.)

St. Bonaventure known as the "Seraphic Doctor" for his masterful development of theology and philosophy, never in their own right, but always as servants of faith in the Triune God, St. Bonaventure was also skillful in fostering peace and unity within the struggles and growing pains of the early Franciscan community. Recognizing his gift of moderation and clarity of focus, he was made the seventh Minister General of the Order of Friars Minor.

Damien Vorreux, OFM notes: "St. Bonaventure understood that unity had to have as its basis, not total uniformity of the practical conditions of life, but communion of one and the same ideal in the love of the one and only Father."

Taking his cue from the undivided witness of St. Francis's love of God the Father through Christ Crucified, the foundational value of this total love and its repercussions in living life well for the sake of the Gospel is expressed throughout St. Bonaventure's writings. For example, in his "Minor Life", a biography of sorts about St. Francis of Assisi. he writes:

"St. Francis was filled with such a spirit of gentle compassion, which came to him from the Source of Mercy itself, that he seemed to have a mother's tenderness in caring for the sufferings of those in misery. He was kind by nature and the love of Christ merely intensified this. His whole soul went out to the sick and the poor, and where he could not offer material assistance he lavished his affection: the poverty or deprivation he saw in anyone he immediately referred to Christ in his heartfelt compassion. In every poor person he met, he saw the image of Christ and he insisted on giving them anything which had been given to him, even if he had urgent need of it; indeed, he believed that he was bound to give it to them just as if it belonged to them... He wanted nothing more than to spend and be spent himself, in order to fulfill the duty of being compassionate towards others."

St. Bonaventure died on July 15, 1274, while serving as a Cardinal during the Second Council of Lyons.

All-powerful Father, may we who celebrate the feast of St. Bonaventure always benefit from his wisdom and follow the example of his love. Amen.
