YEAR OF MERCY-LENTEN JOURNEY-WEEK 5 Lent - A Time To Ponder Deeply

Scripture: You shall be holy, for I the Lord your God am holy. Levicus 19:2

Speaking to his weekly general audience in St. Peter's square just one day after launching his global Jubilee year of mercy, the pontiff said that "only a merciful church shines." The Holy Father stated further that in our era of deep changes, the church is called to offer its particular contribution, making visible the signs of the presence and closeness of God.

It is true this Jubilee year is a special time called by the Catholic Church to receive blessings and pardon from God and remission of sins. He stated that "the necessary work of renewal of the Church's institutions and structures is a means that must bring us to make alive and enlivened the experience of God's Mercy that alone can guarantee a church that is a city upon a hill that cannot remain hidden." National Catholic Register

He called the Jubilee a "privileged moment" in which the church "may learn to choose only that which God loves most - forgiving His children, having mercy on them, in order that they may, in turn, forgive their brothers and sisters, shining as torches of God's Mercy in the world." He is calling the Ecclesial Church to be a lighthouse for all God's children extending mercy, forgiveness, love and welcoming.

Remember the whole church is called to Conversion and Holiness.

We are the Living Church.

It is by living our lives and offering our own Christian witness in our everyday occupations that we are called to become holy: each of us in the condition and state of life in which we find ourselves. Every statereligious, married, single leads us to sanctity, if lived in communion with the Lord and in the service of one's neighbor.

The Triduum

As a church we enter into the most Holiest of weeks as we recall the tremendous sacrifice Christ paid for us. The Triduum, Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter, can be seen as one continuous liturgy.

On Holy Thursday we recall the Lord's institution of the Eucharist and His mandate for us to "wash feet." At the end of the mass we will have a solemn procession from the church to the Parish Hall. As we make our way, we sing the ancient hymn associated with this day. Afterwards, the Blessed Sacrament will be moved to the Francis Room until midnight. Just as Jesus asked the disciples to "watch and pray" the Church has used these few hours as a time of prayer and reflection.

On Good Friday we remember Christ's ultimate sacrifice on the cross. During the service we will come forward and venerate the cross as we wish; with a kiss, a bow, or signing yourself with a cross. As you approach the cross we ask that there be four abreast.

At the **Easter Vigil** we will gather outside in the courtyard for the blessing of the Easter fire. Please use both entrances to enter the church. Once inside we begin the reading of our past which culminates in the account of the Resurrection. Those to be baptized will process to the waters of new life.

Please join us for all of these moving and spiritual moments.
