O Who are the catechumens?

A Catechumens are unbaptized persons (adult or children of catechetical age) who have celebrated the Rite of Acceptance

into the Order of Catechumens. Once they have been received into the Order of Catechumens, they have an official status in the Catholic Church. Like a mother, the Church cares for catechumens, nourishing them with the celebration of the Word in the Sunday liturgy and other celebrations of the Word, as well as other rites such as anointing with the Oil of Catechumens, blessings, and minor exorcisms. The Church has designated appropriate rites of marriage and burial for catechumens. The names of all who have celebrated the Rite of Acceptance are recorded in a special registry, and a person celebrates the Rite of Acceptance only once.

O When are catechumens ready for the next stage?

A Catechumens move into the Period of Purification and Enlightenment (the third period

of the initiation process) after sufficient time in the Period of the Catechumenate (the second stage), where conversion takes root and faith strengthens. At least one year in the Period of the Catechumenate is recommended to experience the unfolding of the mysteries throughout an entire liturgical year. In the weeks before Lent a process of discernment takes place. Along with their sponsor, catechists, pastor, and others who may have been involved, the catechumens discern the movement of the Holy Spirit, take stock of their ongoing conversion, and reaffirm the intention to continue on the journey to Baptism. 

The Transfiguration

Pope Francis reflected on the Transfiguration with pilgrims gathered in St. Peter's Square on the Second Sunday in Lent. What does he say is the important message of the Transfiguration?

The mountain is the site of the encounter of intimate closeness with God - the place of prayer, in which to stand in the presence of the Lord. We, the disciples of Jesus, are called to be people who listen to His voice and take his words seriously. To listen to Jesus, we must follow Him.

We need to go to a place of retreat, to climb the mountain and go to a place of silence, to find ourselves and better perceive the voice of the Lord. We cannot stay there, however. The encounter with God in prayer again pushes us to "come down from the mountain" and back down into the plain, where we meet many brothers and sisters weighed down by fatigue, injustice, and both material and spiritual poverty.


