THE TRIDUUM

As a church we enter into the most Holiest of weeks as we recall the tremendous sacrifice Christ paid for us. The Triduum, Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter, can be seen as one continuous liturgy.

On **HOLY THURSDAY** we recall the Lord's institution of the Eucharist and His mandate for us to "wash feet." At the end of the mass we will have a solemn procession from the church to the Parish Hall. As we make our way, we sing the ancient hymn associated with this day. Afterwards, the Blessed Sacrament will be moved to the Francis Room until midnight. Just as Jesus asked the disciples to "watch and pray" the Church has used these few hours as a time of prayer and reflection.

On **GOOD FRIDAY** we remember Christ's ultimate sacrifice on the cross. During the service we will come forward and venerate the cross as we wish; with a kiss, a bow, or signing yourself with a cross. As you approach the cross we ask that there be four abreast.

At the **EASTER VIGIL** we will gather outside in the courtyard for the blessing of the Easter fire. Please use both entrances to enter the church. Once inside we begin the reading of our past which culminates in the account of the Resurrection. Those to be baptized will process to the waters of new life.

YEAR OF MERCY- LENTEN JOURNEY- WEEK 6

Reflection: Since the beginning of Lent until now we have prepared our hearts by penance and charitable works. This Passion/Palm Sunday we will gather together to herald with the whole church the beginning of the celebration of Our Lord's Paschal Ministry, his Passion and Resurrection. With all faith and devotion, let us commemorate the Lord's entry into the city for our salvation, following in his footsteps, so that, being made, by his grace, partakers of the Cross, we may have a share also in His Resurrection and His Life.

Suffering naturally leads to questioning Why do I suffer? Why do others suffer? How can suffering be overcome? Is there any meaning to suffering? These are difficult and sometimes very frustrating questions. In his apostolic letter Salvifici Doloris (On the Christian meaning of Human Suffering) Pope Paul II reminds us that suffering is part of human existence from birth to death and he counsels us that Love is the richest source of the meaning of suffering which always remains a mystery. He says that reducing suffering to a single solution does not do justice to its complexities.

Suffering of Christ redeems suffering itself and opens up the possibility that the sufferer can share in the redemptive work of Christ. St. Paul teaches us in 1 Corinthians 1:18 "For the word of the Cross is folly to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God." Suffering encompasses every aspect of our being, physical, psychological, emotional and spiritual.

If we open the Door to our hearts and invite God into our suffering situations, and those of our families and communities, and unite these sufferings to those of Christ, we are actually offering them to God as our prayer. In turn, God transforms our suffering and ourselves as he unleashes love in our hearts allowing us to embrace our own afflictions and reach out to each other. He invites us to live from our souls as people of compassion, love and mercy. Now our suffering is a participation in the Mystery of Christ, who does not explain the abstract reasons for suffering, but says "Follow Me! Come! Take part through your suffering in this work of saving the world, a salvation achieved through my suffering on the **Cross.**" (On the Christian Meaning of Human Suffering, Feb. 11, 1984,26) During this weeks of Lent let us praise and thank God for his redemptive Suffering. Let us be present at our parish services asking God to help us grow in love and mercy towards ourselves and others. Let us take advantage of quiet moments when we can just be in silence allowing God an opportunity to touch our hearts and souls.

Prayer: Refrain: Sacred Heart of Jesus, we place our trust in You.

- For responsible governments called to rule in peace, mercy and justice...R
