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

## And Now, A Word from Our Pastor

Last Sunday our St. Bonaventure community was enriched by the celebration of the Rite of Acceptance into the Catechumenate for **Rana**. *Rana* now joins *Christina*, *David*, *Garry* and *Ken*, our other Catechumens, on their journey toward Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist.


"Catechumenate" comes from a word which means "to echo." During their journey, Catechumens hear the Word and practice of our Catholic Faith echoed to them through their participation in the Liturgy of the Word on Sundays, the witness which we offer them as baptized believers, times of reflection with our catechists, the support of their sponsors, and the experience of their lives. As they journey progresses, more and more they hear the voice of Jesus echoing in their hearts igniting a fire of desire to be united with Him and with us.

The Catechumenate isn't tied to a time line. It begins with the Rite of Acceptance and concludes with the celebration of the Sacraments. Each Catechumen's journey is unique, respecting the way the Spirit of God moves in her or him. The right time for the sacraments isn't determined by the calendar, but by the heart: God's Heart and the heart of the Catechumen.

Our five Catechumens have discerned that God is not calling them to celebrate the Sacraments now, but to continue as Catechumens, experiencing the full cycle of liturgical seasons and feasts and deepening their lives with the Lord and our community. We accompany them with our affection and our prayer. And we thank them for their example.

# Q How can the assembly help the catechumens?

A In many ways! Through their friendly, welcoming demeanor toward catechumens, by learning their names, greeting them, and



engaging them in conversation, assembly members reassure them that they have a place in the community. Most of the rites of initiation take place at Sunday Mass. By its attention and participation in these rites, the assembly expresses the community's care and encouragement for the catechumens. What's more, at every liturgy, catechumens look to assembly members as models, following their example and reflecting on the meaning of the rituals as they watch the assembly's responses. Welcoming the catechumens into parish activities not only makes them feel included, it also provides them glimpses of the life of disciples. Becoming a sponsor for a catechumen is yet another way assembly members could be helpful. Finally, the faithful can pray for the catechumens throughout the week.
