Do You Love Me?


God lovingly pursues us, calling us far beyond our own safety zones to share the good news of salvation. We see this clearly in the life of the apostle Peter.

And Now, A Word from Our Pastor

So, what's that design in the center of the middle aisle of our church? A cross, one arm with a sleeve, the other without, hands depicted palms out to reveal wounds. It's the symbol of the Franciscan Order. Central to the symbol is the Cross of Jesus – the place where the selfgiving love of our God was revealed in its fulness. The arm of Jesus (without a sleeve) stretches in front of the Cross and His hand displays the wound of the nail which help Him bound but set us free. The arm (with the sleeve of the Franciscan habit) and wounded hand of St. Francis intersect with those of Jesus. Our Patron. St. Bonaventure. tells us that Francis burned with love for Jesus; his love was so intense that Francis' own hands were marked with the wounds of Jesus' love for us. Francis shared that love in service to others. He became an icon of Jesus. The Franciscan symbol of the Cross with the intersecting arms and hands of Jesus and Francis is a visual call to love – to receive the love of God given to us through Jesus, to return that love to God in worship and to imitate that love by being Jesus to others.
