

Parable of the ten bridesmaids

Jesus' parable is about being watchful and well prepared. Is the "stay awake" assignment just for people over a certain age, or people who have gotten bad news from their doctors? When you watch for God in your life do you sometimes "doze off"? What exactly were you waiting for?

In one of his General Audiences, Pope Francis discusses the parable of the ten virgins. He mentions keeping our hearts open to "goodness, beauty and truth." How would that help us see signs of Christ's presence in the world?

The Bridegroom is the Lord, and the time of waiting for his arrival is the time he gives to us, to all of us, before his Final Coming; ... it is a time of watchfulness; a time in which we must keep alight the lamps of faith, hope and charity, a time in which to keep our heart open to goodness, beauty and truth. ... What he asks of us is to be ready for the encounter-ready for an encounter, for a beautiful encounter, the encounter with Jesus, which means being able to see the signs of his presence, keeping our faith alive with prayer, with the sacraments, and taking care not to fall asleep so as to not forget about God. ...Let us not fall asleep!


