STEWARDSHIP - PARISH FINANCIAL REPORT FOR SIX MONTHS ENDED 30 JUNE 2019

With the Finance Council, I share with you the summary of our revenues and expenses for the six-month period that ended 30 June, 2019. Comparative figures show a 3% increase in revenue and a 0.8% increase in expenses from last year. While last year's figures revealed a net loss of 10,319, this year's reveal a net gain of 19,411. Recent activity of the Council includes: a) Following a study and recommendation by a subcommittee of the Council, a portion of our finances will be invested. b) Funds will be allocated for necessary repair of the stained-glass window in the organ loft. c) Decision and action regarding the upgrading of the exterior doors of the church and parish center are imminent.

Our Patron, St. Bonaventure, experienced our Trinity God as the Mystery of Self-giving Love. You are images of the self-giving love of our God in the self-giving love you express in your support of our Parish. I thank you not only for that support but also for your example. What a remarkable community I am privileged to be a part of.
