



In today's gospel Jesus denounces the Pharisees and scribes for practising a superficial faith that is overly concerned with how they are seen by others.

For whom do we make our displays of faith? Do we practice our piety out of joy at what the Lord has done for us? Or out of fear of social rejection; a desire to win the praise and good opinion of others; or merely to attract attention?

In asking us to examine the motivations behind our actions, God helps us to realize more deeply who the object of our worship is: others, ourselves or God? Today, God invites us to free ourselves from our pride and make him the object of our worship.

So, when we feel the temptation to keep one eye open during the prayers at Mass to spy which of our friends bothered to show up, or recite the Creed a little louder than the person sitting next to us, let us remember that today's celebration of Mass is about honouring our Lord.


