
October 27, 2019 **Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time**



According to Pope Francis, God has a weakness for the humble ones and their prayers open God's heart wide.

Dear brothers and Sisters: In our continuing catechesis for this Holy Year of Mercy, we now turn to the parable of the Pharisee and the Tax Collector (Lk 18:9-14). Jesus contrasts the arrogance and self-righteousness of the *Pharisee's prayer with the tax collector's humble* recognition of his sinfulness and need for the Lord's mercy. True prayer is born of a heart which repents of its faults and failings yet pleads for the grace to live the great commandment of love of God and neighbour. Indeed, the proud disdain of the Pharisee for the sinner at his side prevents him from being righteous in God's sight. To pray well, then, we need to look into our own hearts and there, in humble silence, let the Lord speak to us. The honesty and humility which God asks of us is the necessary condition for our receiving his mercy.

And Now, A Word from Our Pastor

At the liturgy, everyone has a role. First and foremost, the Assembly, the People of God gathered for Liturgy, are essential. The Assembly is the Body of Christ attentive to the Word of God. offering the one Sacrifice of Christ, sharing in Bread and Cup of His Eucharistic Meal. From among the People of God, some members have roles of service to the Assembly: Presiding Priest, Lectors, Cantors, Eucharistic Ministers, Ushers, Minister of Hospitality, Choirs, Musicians, etc. Altar Servers lead the procession to begin the liturgy, accompanying the entrance of the Cross and the Book of the Gospels into the Assembly. They present the book so the Presider can collect the pravers of those gathered and offer the Opening Prayer (The Collect). Servers assist in receiving the bread and wine and prepare the altar. Throughout the Liturgy they keep their eyes and ears open to attend to whatever might be needed.

Last week at St. Paul's Basilica the Archdiocese highlighted the role of Altar Servers. We congratulate Titus Menezes, Mia Ongkeko, and Holden Wontorra who received Altar Servers Awards at St. Paul's Basilica. We are proud of them and of all our Altar Servers. Thank you for your service to God and to us; thank you for your example to us.
