



Matthew 22:34-40

You were made in God's image and likeness, and every good thing you have comes from God. What does God ask in return? Whatever your answer, is it always easy? Discuss whether "love your neighbour" includes your arrogant neighbour or just your kind neighbour.

Pope Francis made remarks about love and one of the first steps toward that love. In overcoming anger or rivalry, he suggests praying for the other person. Would that help you accept the other as brother or sister?

What is the law of the People of God? It is the law of love, love for God and love for neighbour according to the new commandment that the Lord left to us (Jn 13:34). It is a love, however, that is not sterile sentimentality or something vague, but the acknowledgment of God as one Lord of Life and, at the same time, the acceptance of the other as my true brother, overcoming division, rivalry, misunderstanding, selfishness; these two things go together. We must ask the Lord to make us correctly understand this law of love. How beautiful it is to love one another as true brothers and sisters. How beautiful!



Background to Liturgy of the Word with

Children: We are blessed to be able to celebrate the Liturgy of the Word with Children at the 10 a.m. Sunday Eucharist. Parishioners dedicate themselves to support the children's encounter with the Risen Lord through worship with the Scriptures. What happens during this separate celebration of the Word of God? To answer this question, we'll present a series of articles over the next few weeks that focus on foundational aspects of our worship with the Word, and then we'll explore what this means for children. First, let's focus on a hallmark of Catholic identity: "Our Liturgical Spirituality." Please read the article with this title by Kristopher W. Seaman, inserted in this bulletin.
