#### "So, what's a Synod"

"Where two or three gathered, I will be in their midst." This week representatives are gathering in Rome for a Synod about the Church in the Amazon. One bishop, who participated in a recent synod, explained "every bishop and representative of local church communities (dioceses and countries) make the journey to Rome for a Synod carrying the sufferings and hopes of the People of God entrusted to their care." At a Synod, lay persons, religious, priests and bishops, together with the Pope, commit themselves to discover the will of God through prayer to the Holy Spirit, reflection, discussion (and sometimes arguing). In the words of the Second Vatican Council they read "the signs of the time and interpret them in the light of the Gospel." The word "Synod" comes from two Greek words meaning: "together on the way." We join the Synod participants in prayer as walk together to discover how to let God's goodness, mercy and love flourish in the Church in the Amazon.
