

## September 9, 2018 The Twenty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

In the first reading, Isaiah calls forth courage in each of us. "Be strong, do not fear," for God will save, giving sight to the blind and hearing to the deaf. During the exile in Babylon, the Israelites must have felt abandoned and alone. Isaiah's news of God's everlasting love was a glimmer of light in the darkness.

In todays Gospel, God shows, through Jesus, His love to his people by overcoming social barriers and healing through touch. In a time of stringent laws of purity, this was a bold act of mercy. Illness and disability were seen as a sign of the presence of sin. Jesus reaches across this social boundary and wipes it away, healing the broken and demonstrating his love for the marginalized.

Saint James calls each of us to follow in Jesus' footsteps - may we participate in the kingdom by reaching beyond barriers in order to show kindness and love to others. The sign of God's miraculous love is present to us every day through words and deeds that, inspired by grace, bring healing and comfort. These small miracles bring God's light to the places of darkness in our world. If we open our hearts to the visceral love, won't we too want to zealously share the Good news?

## Blessed Frédéric Ozanam

(April 23, 1813-Sept. 8, 1853)
A man convinced of the inestimable worth of each human being, Frederic served the poor of Paris well, and drew others into serving the poor of the world.
Through the St. Vincent de Paul Society, which he founded, his

work continues to the present day. Frederic was beatified in 1997 and his Liturgical Feast Day is **September 9.** Frederic Ozanam always respected the poor while offering whatever service he could. Each man, woman, and child was too precious to live in poverty. Serving the poor taught Frederic something about God that he could not have learned elsewhere.
