Preparation for Confirmation



- Sunday, October 6th, 1:15 to 2:30 pm, or
- Tuesday, October 8th, 7:00 to 8:15 pm

Liturgy of the Word with Children: Sundays at the 10 am Mass



Lost Sheep

Today's liturgy is about the lost sheep, the people who "have become depraved," the criminals and doers of evil who have offended against God and society. These are the lost people who are like the prodigal son, wasting everything they have on dissolute living. They present a challenge to us just as the prodigal son presented a challenge to his family.

The message today's liturgy is forgiveness, leaving the ninetynine sheep in the wasteland and following the lost one until he is found. Our model is the father of the prodigal son, who forgives the past and welcomes his dead son back to life. Our task is to reconcile, for "the Good News of reconciliation God has entrusted to us."

It is contrary to the spirit of this liturgy to lock people up in prison and on death row and forget about them. Our task of reconciliation involves making it possible for the most "lost" human beings to rise "and go to my Father."

We worship God by professing our belief that "Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners." We worship God by rejoicing in the salvation of the lost sheep.
