# **Twenty-fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time**

For the kingdom of heave is like a landowner who went out early in the morning to hire workers for his vineyard.

Matthew 20. 1-16

# News from the St. Vincent de Paul Society

St. Vincent de Paul (24 April 1581 – 27 September 1660) was a French Roman Catholic priest who dedicated himself to serving the poor. He is venerated as a saint in the Catholic Church and the Anglican Communion. He was canonized in 1737. He was renowned for his compassion, humility and generosity.

Vincent is the patron of all works of charity. A number of organizations specially inspired by his work and teaching and which claim St. Vincent de Paul as their founder or Patron, are grouped in a loose federation known as the Vincentian Family.

Among these organizations is the Society of Saint Vincent de Paul, a charitable organization dedicated to the service of the poor, established in 1833 by French university students, led by the Blessed Frederic Ozanam. The Society is today present in 132 countries.
