Preparation for First Reconciliation and First Communion

Evangelization: This is one of the major elements of the 7 areas a Pastoral Council considers. I believe that we need to see this as the under pinning of everything we do. The 'compelling spirit" of what we do here at St. Bonaventure's. It is so essential that every group, every committee should use this as a lens for their activities.

We Catholics are slow to appreciate or understand this word. Especially in regions where Catholicism is either a major denomination or long accepted one. Yet the most recent Popes are challenging us to a "New Evangelization". What does that mean?

Now you may have visions of knocking on people's doors like the Mormons or standing on street corners handing out bibles. That is not it. However, in my past experience and in fact the experience in the larger world, there are folks of different denominations who are not only quite willing but eager to share their faith. We see the vast inroads that Evangelicals have made in traditionally Catholic areas.

So what is a vision of evangelization? Put in the simplest terms, it is an enthusiasm and recognition of the gift of faith. One is so convinced that their faith gives them meaning and purpose in life. Because we have discovered the essentials of living, we are eager to share that Good News with others. You know, the same way we get excited and want to share a new recipe, or our attachment to some sports team. Or more simply put, by the joy we find in life, other's will want to know what is our secret. And then we are willing to share it.

If we could dream of what it could look like for our parish, it might be something like this. A people so rooted in their faith and excited about it that they are willing to share their faith story with others. Again, this is not done in a "hit someone over the head" approach, but springs from the joy that they have discovered and wish to share it with those around them. They would especially seek out the fallen away Catholics as well as those who have no faith affiliation. It would be normative for them to invite people to come to Mass or some other function at the parish. Do we dare dream this dream and make it a reality? *Friar David Stachurski*
