Preparation for First Reconciliation and First Communion

• Tuesday, September 24th, 7:00 to 8:30 pm

Preparation for Confirmation

In September 2015, the age when youth may begin to prepare for and celebrate Confirmation was lowered to age 12 in the Archdiocese of Toronto. If your child is baptised Roman Catholic and 12 years old (grade 7) or older, then it will be important for you and your son or daughter to attend one of the following Parent-Youth Confirmation Information Meetings held in the Main Hall of the Parish Centre to learn about the preparation process, registration, and celebration of Confirmation:

Sunday, October 6th, 1:15 to 2:30 pm, or

Tuesday, October 8th, 7:00 to 8:15 pm .

Liturgy of the Word with Children: Sundays at the 10 am Mass

Through the dedication of volunteers, we are fortunate to be able to invite children to celebrate the Liturgy of the Word in a way in which they can more easily participate. We believe that the Lord is present when we gather for worship and when the Scriptures are proclaimed. We help our children encounter the Lord, interiorize the message of the Sunday Gospel, and pray together. We hope this experience of the Liturgy will lead our children into full, active, and conscious participation during the Mass as they get older, to which we are all called. This ministry is geared to children from age 4 to age 9. The volunteers will resume the Liturgy of the Word with Children at the 10:00 am Mass on Sunday, 15th September.


